RB: Is there a date for next year? AP: Not yet but will be end of May weekend.	
UKSPF / Business Decarbonisation Grant (David Kelly, Nottingham City Council)	
DK presented slides	
This grant is an excellent means by which businesses can progress decarbonisation projects.	
Questions / Discussion	
• SA: Is there any information on next year? DK: We will be looking to deliver this via EMCCA next year. LAEP has identified that we don't have great levers with businesses, so we are in	
conversation with them.	
 SA: Will Local Green Skills be continued? RK: Also looking at delivery through EMCCA. 	
JS: Are businesses owned by NCC applicable? RK: Actual ownership isn't important, the tenant is	
the applicant so it would be acceptable, we've previously worked with Nottingham Playhouse and	I
Broadway Cinema. Providing the match comes from the applicant, they can use a grant secured	
from elsewhere.	

- MK: We rent office in city centre; how do you deal with landlords? RK: We wouldn't get involved but imagine most landlords will support as measures as they bring cost savings. RB: Not always, we've found many landlords are resistant to change. DK: Anything with at or below an EPC F cannot be let, therefore will become more appealing, would advise to make business case. MK: Ours is listed building. DK: Listed and protection areas, we would review for considerations but not necessarily a barrier.
- MK (to group): If anyone has experience negotiating with landlords, please let me know.
- RB: Have you considered using part of the fund for loans rather than grants? If we had this system, it could provide an ongoing fund for future projects. DK: Not easy, issue of people repaying loans, but haven't looked at it as local authority. MG: we are already looking at it at EMCCA, seeing if its viable.
- CPH: Excluding maintenance and repairs, why does this not have greater uptake as many buildings would benefit? DK: Restrictions such as introducing glazing, improving windows are permissible. We offer it on a case-by-case basis, working with applicant to make it work. I am interested in carbon reductions, want a minimum of 245 kCO2 / £1,000.
- SA: How do you communicate this to businesses? DK: Routes to market, Growth Hub, EMCCA, Chamber, NCC website, the universities, Medilink, social media. We get lots of promotion through chamber. SA: Aware of a small Sri Lankan shop that would benefit, how do you reach corner shops? DK: We've had a lot of interest from small corner shops, lots through word of mouth. Programme to work with minority business owners, we have someone within our team who is a business advisor working with this.

Nottingham Climate Assembly Update (Julian Marsh, Nottingham Climate Assembly)

JM provided verbal presentation

- We now have 30 trained volunteers involved. There have now been 17 mini assemblies conducted, the latest mini assembly was with NTU, which saw over 65 attendees
- Unfortunately, unsuccessful with lottery bid to fund sortition, talking to MG at EMCCA to find an alternative route
- Please note that the Crowdfunder still open and accepting donations
- It's been costed that the sortition and project management will be most expensive items
- Despite these setbacks, we are committed to running main assembly late spring 2026
- We've published online guidance for community groups, and NTU are writing papers about the mini assembly approach

Questions / Discussion

- RW: What's the definition of a mini assembly? JM: Minimum 25 people, run by local group, they choose the questions.
- CPH: Do you need any support from people in the room? JM: Once we start planning in September yes, we will.

Workshop: NGP Progress Review & Forward Planning (Richard Barlow (chair) / All)

RB led on workshop activity which asked members to split into three groups and to consider whether there is anything which NGP could be doing differently or better?

Feedback from activity:

Righthand Group

• Introduce a NGP introduction pack for new members

- Website: Publish slides of previous meetings, upcoming funding, significant upcoming meetings, events and consultations, data on CN28 progress
- Create a digital chat space for members, through website or app

Middle Group

- Create space to promote what NGP have achieved; people need to understand why this group is successful
- How much do people know we exist? We need to share and share more, to gain higher profile

Lefthand Group

- Need to define where have we come from to understand our future
- Website: Add NGP Terms of Reference (ToR) and our vision
- We are time and resource poor but experience and information rich
- For better cross working, a shared google document could provide a directory of NGP members and other Group accessible text/documents.

Summary from RB

- Suggests we should listen to what the assembly outcomes are, and use those as a mandate for the partnership going forward
- When we have used remote meetings, we did find we had more attendance
- In 2023 we formed 5 task and finish groups, they still exist in some form but they aren't formally recognised in this group should we be doing more with them?
- How do we capture the amazing work of what all the members do? Difficult for us to capture from the centre.
